## Answers to Quiz on The Apostle Paul

1. Saul (Acts 13:9)
2. The tribe of Benjamin (Philippians 3:5)
3. Gamaliel (Acts 22:3)
4. The stoning of Stephen. And Saul (Paul) was there, giving approval of his death. (Acts 7:58)
5. (13 books or letters) some have suggested that Paul wrote the book of Hebrews but there is not enough evidence to prove one way or the other. The 13 letters are: Romans, 1 Corinthians, 2 Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, 1 Thessalonians, 2 Thessalonians, 1 Timothy, 2 Timothy, Titus, and Philemon.
6. Paul took 3 missionary trips.
7. Paul was from the Roman city of Tarsus, located in what is today southern Turkey. (Acts of the Apostles 21:39)
8. Paul was a Roman citizen from a wealthy family. (Acts of the Apostles 22:25–28)
9. Paul belonged to the Pharisees, a Jewish religious group.
10. Paul was the Apostle to the Gentiles (Romans 11:13)
11. Barnabas – (Acts 13 and 14)
12. Silas – After Paul and Barnabas separated because of their disagreement over taking John Mark with them, he chose Silas to be his partner on the journey to the churches. (Acts 15:36-41)
13. The Council at Jerusalem – The council was held to discuss the inclusion of Gentiles in the Christian faith and whether they should be required to follow Jewish customs and laws. The council ultimately decided that Gentiles did not need to adhere to all Jewish customs, paving the way for the spread of Christianity among non-Jewish communities. (Acts 15)
14. Paul's custom was to go the Jewish synagogue first and teach from the Scriptures the truth of Jesus Christ. (Acts 17:2-3)
15. Paul was a tentmaker by trade. (Acts 18:1-3)
16. The Third Missionary Journey – After allowing the winter to pass, Paul started his 3<sup>rd</sup> Missionary Journey in the spring of AD 52. Paul's journey brought him to Ephesus where he stayed for 2 years and 3 months. (Paul in Ephesus, Acts 19:8-10)
17. Felix and Festus – (The Trial before Felix, Acts 24:1-27; The Trial before Festus, Acts 25:1-21)
18. King Agrippa (Acts 26:1-29)
19. The island of Malta (Acts 28:1)
20. Two years – (Acts 28:16,30)
