

Pastor's Word by Pastor Donald Gardner

"Hold on to your Hats"

"Hold on to your Hats!" Whether it is seen as exciting or overwhelming, when something is rather unexpected or viewed as fantastically different, it may bring feelings of exhilaration. For some of us, change is always uncomfortable while others see the reality that things are always in a state of alteration or movement. Whether it be political leadership or the adjustment to a new Catholic Pope, our society demands that all of us learn to accept change as inevitable. When I reflect on the habits and customs of 50 years ago, I remember some things with great fondness. Those were simpler times and modes of behavior seemed more respectful toward how people treated others. The words people spoke and how people dressed were reflections on a desire to have sensitivity toward the emotional feelings of others. Today, it often appears that society has become accustomed to the "me first generational attitude" that presents oneself as the center of decisions and actions. I'll not try to justify the "why" our world has moved in this direction but I will say that, for the Christian, this worldview is certainly not what Jesus desired to see.

Jesus could have focused on a self-absorbed and prideful concern toward his life but that would not have led to his completing his ultimate role as the Forgiver of our sin. He was sacrificial in his full identity. He was concerned about presenting the values of God above what was "humanly natural" around Him. Jesus was surrounded by a world that presented sinful behavior as an option for Him while he chose a better response to those things. His model of caring for the needs of sinful and confused mankind brought a mixed response from those he came in contact with. Yet, it is the consistency of Christ's testimony that demands a choice by each of us to either desire His discipling mentorship or follow the values of our world. Living a life under constant evaluation, self-sacrifice, and criticism was, undoubtedly, stressful and disappointing for Jesus. Yet, he challenged the people of His day to change from secular goals in life to being the true chosen people of God. Today, we too must hear Christ's challenge to be the people of God with how we see ourselves as living sacrifices in a world of confused people.
