Revelation 2:12-29 (CSB)

12 "Write to the angel of the church in Pergamum: Thus says the one who has the sharp, double-edged sword: 13 I know where you live—where Satan's throne is. Yet you are holding on to my name and did not deny your faith in me, even in the days of Antipas, my faithful witness who was put to death among you, where Satan lives. 14 But I have a few things against you. You have some there who hold to the teaching of Balaam, who taught Balak to place a stumbling block in front of the Israelites: to eat meat sacrificed to idols and to commit sexual immorality. 15 In the same way, you also have those who hold to the teaching of the Nicolaitans. 16 So repent! Otherwise, I will come to you quickly and fight against them with the sword of my mouth. 17 Let anyone who has ears to hear listen to what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who conquers, I will give some of the hidden manna. I will also give him a white stone, and on the stone a new name is inscribed that no one knows except the one who receives it. 18 Write to the angel of the church in Thyatira: Thus says the Son of God, the one whose eyes are like a fiery flame and whose feet are like fine bronze: 19 I know your works—your love, faithfulness, service, and endurance. I know that your last works are greater than the first. 20 But I have this against you: You tolerate the woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophetess and teaches and deceives my servants to commit sexual immorality and to eat meat sacrificed to idols. 21 I gave her time to repent, but she does not want to repent of her sexual immorality. 22 Look, I will throw her into a sickbed and those who commit adultery with her into great affliction. Unless they repent of her works, 23 I will strike her children dead. Then all the churches will know that I am the one who examines minds and hearts, and I will give to each of you according to your works. 24 I say to the rest of you in Thyatira, who do not hold this teaching, who haven't known "the so-called secrets of Satan" —as they say—I am not putting any other burden on you. 25 Only hold on to what you have until I come. 26 The one who conquers and who keeps my works to the end: I will give him authority over the nations—27 and he will rule them with an iron scepter; he will shatter them like pottery—28 just as I have received this from my Father. I will also give him the morning star. 29 Let anyone who has ears to hear listen to what the Spirit says to the churches.

III. Church in Pergamum, v12-17: The message is to restrain from being a prideful church as that church didn't stand up to (v.14) reviewing who they allowed into their circle and will force the Lord to judge their irresponsibility with their behavior.

IV. Church in Thyatira, v18-29: The church has been recognized for its faith but the compromises with immorality and societal activity demand the holiness of God to judge as needed. The Father is a holy God and can't stand to remain in the midst of sinful behavior.

Pastor's Word by Pastor Donald Gardner

" Pop Bottles & Sport's Cards "

Can you remember what you did when you were 10 years old? One of the many things I did was to collect pop bottles along the side of the road. Each bottle was valued at 2 cents each. Once I'd collected enough of them, I could purchase gum packets that had sports cards inside. Each packet of gum, with cards, cost around 10 cents and provided hours of fun with friends as we compared/traded our cards for the best players. Life was simple around those cards!

As we grow older, holding on to the simple and purer things of life becomes more difficult. What motivates the values, actions, and thinking of those around us often differs from ourselves. That which was pure and simple has become complex, confusing, and less than gracious. Definitions of a successful life and how we relate to others becomes frustrating at times.

Jesus' life model was simple and pure. In his own way, I don't doubt that Jesus had his own pop bottles and sport cards as a child. Yet as an adult, his focus was clearly to love people, forgive their sin, present truth, and provide people with a meaningful life of direction. Jesus "held tight" to his clarity of life's purpose even when it gave Him every reason to walk away from his life task. Life does become more complicated than pop bottles & trading cards but we must be like Christ and hold to the clear and simple task of being salt and light even when the path we see looks difficult, or even impossible to manage. Let us live "simple and pure !"
