New Year's Aim: Imitate Your Heavenly Father! Ephesians 5:1-7 (CSB)

<u>Main Point</u>: Christians are called to mirror the holiness of God by living in a sacrificial manner based on Christ's love for us. The world's standard stands in total contrast to the kingdom's standards, and God calls his followers not to even be associated with it.

Discussion Questions:

- 2. What does it mean to "walk in love"?
- 3. What is the difference between the worldly concept of love and the Scriptural teaching on love?
- 4. Is it possible for Christians to actively commit sin or live a sinful life and yet be called Christians?
- 5. How does one gain an inheritance in the kingdom of God?
- 6. What can you do to build guardrails against deception and the ways of the world?
- 7. Write a short prayer asking Father God to give power to imitate Him as his beloved child.

- b. Solidify your understanding of Christ's sacrifice for you
- c. Seek accountability to resist lusts, with the Holy Spirit's help
